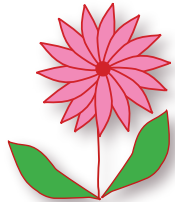


How to Understand Different Types of Words

Noun

A noun is the name of a person, place, or thing – either abstract (**love** is wonderful) or concrete (the **flower** bloomed).



Verb

A verb expresses action (he **walked** to the theatre) or state of being (she **will be** late).



Adverb

Adverbs describe or limit verbs, adjectives, and other adverbs (he runs **quickly**).

Preposition

A preposition shows the relationship between a noun or pronoun and another noun or pronoun (the towel was **on** the floor).

Pronoun

A pronoun replaces a noun (today **he** found **it**).



Adjective

Adjectives describe or limit nouns or pronouns (it is a **tall** filing cabinet).



Conjunction

A conjunction links words, phrases, or clauses (Mary **and** I went home).
